The Wellness Village will be supporting those who are in need of not only physical therapy, but emotional and psychological therapy as well as the medical offices for the hired personal.

The Hospitality Center will have hotel and restau-

rant facilities.

"Naturally there are regulatory procedures involved in the gameplan such as different kinds of government surveys such as an environmental inspection," Chopra said. "However, I expect to present my plan to the town and the county by spring and should be ready to

go to work to build by fall."

The Shenandoah Wellness Park, from bullet points on its "Our Mission" page included in the master plan, is being proposed to treat military veterans and former professional athletes with "Advanced Medical Treatment, Psychological and Emotional Treatment, Spiritual Counseling, Physical Therapy and Rehabilitation Services and Employment and Career Opportunties"

Chopra who serves as CEO and Chairman of COR-DEV, Inc in Falls Church, graduated with a Ph.D. from the University of Michigan.

He began his career in residential real estate and

then shifted to commercial real estate.

Since then, he owns a private corporation which has several projects and partnerships with the government and military.

Chopra's inspiration to start the wellness park is

simple.

"I live a life which is as honestly as is possible," he said.

"I have always wanted to help others," he added and stressed he believes in two major components to life, which are love and service.

"I am true to my own mission," he emphasized.

Chopra stresses his belief in spiritualism as the core of his life. Discussing why he chose Elkton and the Blue Ridge Mountains, he explains that he met Elkton native June Dean early on in his life and became very interested in the area where her family has deep roots.

It is also an ideal spot for quiet reflection and heal-

ing, he noted.

In addition to the proposed wellness park, Chopra has also purchased various buildings in the downtown area of Elkton, such as the Elkton Theatre and the building that once was known Conrad's Store.
